To kick the month off, Dr. Christine Hahn, State Epidemiologist with the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, will present **Zika Update: Impact on Idaho**. In this talk, Dr. Hahn will provide an update on the Zika virus, as well as other mosquito-borne illnesses that have had changes in their epidemiology recently, like dengue and chikungunya.
